

VILLAGE ORDINANCE 1976 NO. 2, EFF. 3 MAY 1976

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND VILLAGE ORDINANCE 1975 NO. 13 BY ADDING THERETO A PROHIBITION OF OBSTRUCTION OF THE RIGHT-OF-WAY OF ANY STREET OR ALLEY AT SPECIFIED TIMES DURING PARTICULAR MONTHS, AND FOR REMOVAL OF OBSTRUCTIONS.

THE VILLAGE OF ONTONAGON ORDAINS:

Village Ordinance 1975 No. 13, being Ontonagon Village Compiled Ordinances Sections 201.01 through 201.05, is hereby amended by addition of the following sections:

201.02A SAME; OBSTRUCTION OF RIGHT-OF-WAY

It shall be unlawful for any person to leave any automobile or any other vehicle or apparatus standing or parked upon the right-of-way of any street or alley within the Village between the hours of two thirty (2:30) o'clock A.M. and six (6:00) o'clock A.M. on any day from the 15th day of October through the following 15th day of April, unless granted a permit to do so by the Chief of Police of the Village of Ontonagon.

201.04A REMOVAL AND IMPOUNDMENT OF OBSTRUCTIONS

Notwithstanding other penalties, any vehicle or other obstruction found in violation of this Ordinance may be removed by any police officer of the Village and impounded, and no liability shall attach to such officer or to the Village by reason of such impoundment. No property so removed and impounded shall be returned to the owner until payment has been made to the Village of the actual costs incurred by the Village occasioned by such removal and impoundment, and a storage fee of \$1.00 for each day or portion of a day the property remains impounded. If any such vehicle or apparatus is not returned to the owner or his representative, as above provided, for a period of 60 days, it shall be deemed abandoned and disposed of as provided by law.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon expiration of twenty days after its passage.
